The points in bold are the enhanced risk assessment for during COVID 19 and based on Government Guidelines and information gathered from Police, Community Safety Unit, Ascension Trust, First Aid trainer and CSP volunteers.

This risk assessment covers all foreseeable hazards occurring during a Street Pastors patrol and the activities of the Prayer pastors, but should not be considered definitive. Senior Street Pastors should also carry out their own risk assessment for the specific circumstances of their patrol, taking particular heed of any information passed to them either by the CCTV Operators or the Police Duty Officer.

The safety of the team is of primary importance and all decisions and assessments should be made with this in mind, especially at this time.
