What is happening to our world? The times really do seem to be 'out of joint'. How do the Street Pastors manage to break through as channels of the love of God? In spite of the difficulties we continue to thank God for the welcome and appreciation shown to the Street Pastors and for the support of the police. They need our prayers too as do all who work to give pleasure, fun and safety in the nightlife of our town.
