Climbing, Jumping and Running for Luton Street Pastors


Many of our volunteer team take on fundraising challenges for our work.

Recruitment and Training

We currently have 4 ladies on the training path and are hoping they will be able to join the teams out on patrol very soon.

We are also working hard to promote the work of Street Pastors and to encourage more local Christians to get involved, either by becoming a Street Pastor themselves, praying for our work, or giving financially.

Team Breakfast and Worship Morning

On Saturday 4th July many of our volunteer team got together for a breakfast and worship morning. We began with a hearty breakfast at Toby Carvery, as a chance to get to know each other better (particularly for Ros to meet everyone).

We then went on to Word of Faith, where we spent the rest of the morning worshipping in song and praying together.

We prayed for Luton as a town; mapping out areas we felt were significant and praying for individuals we know as well as the safety of the town generally and for other organisations and churches working in the town centre.

We also prayed for each other, particularly for our trustees and the responsibilities they hold.

Prayer Pastors

We believe prayer is a key part of the work we do on our patrols around the town centre. Before a team goes out on their patrol, they spend time in prayer together. Each of our Street Pastors has a friend who will regularly pray for them as they go out on patrol. As they patrol, they pray for the situations they see. If someone asks, they will pray for them on the street. When they get back to base, they pray. And if they feel an issue needs further prayer, they can let the rest of the team know so the rest of us can pray too!

But we need more.

Many Street Pastors initiatives across the country have recruited teams of '**Prayer Pastors**' - faithful Christians who work alongside our Street Pastors, praying for them throughout their patrols.

Prayer Pastors meet at the same time as the Street Pastor patrol, praying for the team before they go out. Then while the Street team patrol, Prayer Pastors stay at base and continue to pray. They are often called or texted by the team on the street with specific things to pray for. They can get creative in their prayer and can also worship and even bring along cakes and snacks. They may also get refreshments ready for the patrol when they come back to the base for a break. The idea is to be *dynamic, lively, interactive and accessible!*

We also know that some would want to pray for the work, but can't get out of their homes that late at night. These 'remote' Prayer Pastors, can also be linked up with the team going out, so they also get real time updates of what's going on in the streets.

National Street Pastors Prayer Week October 25th - 31st

During the week 25th - 31st October there will be a national week of prayer for Street Pastors. Across the country people will gather to pray for the work of our volunteers locally as well as nation-wide.



Facts and Figures

Here are some statistics from our local patrols since our last newsletter (May, June, July and August 2015)



We made direct contact with 367 members of the public, to care for, listen to and help those in need.

We cleared 345 bottles, 636 cans, and 71 broken glasses from the street, making Luton a cleaner, safer place



We gave out 25 pairs of flip flops, 14 bottles of water and 31 hot meals to those in need.

Street Pastors National Gathering

On 16th and 17th July, Ros attended the Ascension Trust National Management and Coordinators Gathering. It was a great opportunity to meet other coordinators, share ideas and be trained and informed by the team at Ascension Trust.

The first day of the conference focused on Prayer Pastors and it was exciting to hear how other Street Pastor Initiatives run things.
