Minehead Street Pastors

Part of the bigger picture

With a current number of national volunteers running into thousands across 250+ schemes, Street Pastors are now here to stay!

At an inspirational praise service in Taunton in May, our latest recruits had the privilege of being commissioned by Rev. Les Isaac, founder of the scheme, and recently awarded the O.B.E. for his work. This was followed in June, by the National Street Pastors & Prayer Pastors conference, again in Taunton and attended by Coordinators from the UK, Republic of Ireland and Wales as well as teams from Antigua and Trinidad and Tobago!

Rev. Les spoke of how it has taken 10 years, to get hold of God's vision for Street Pastors, and for our country, and how relationships are at the heart of Street Pastors – with each other and with Jesus. It is these relationships

that enable us to get on and do what we do with and for people.

From its humble beginnings with 18 people in Brixton, Street Pastors are now to be found in every London Borough and across the length and breadth of the British Isles.

We know what we do in our own communities at weekends, but Jesus is making a difference in other ways as well. In N. Ireland, Street Pastors are bringing people of different backgrounds together in ways not known before; Gibraltar is exploring setting up the scheme and is talking to Spain in the process.

We have to capture data to show the outcomes of Street Pastors – 600,000 volunteer patrol hours equivalent to £15.5 million worth of uniformed presence on the streets,

4,000 weapons removed off the streets etc. However, Les spoke of the ways in which God is doing something far bigger than these statistics show. Volunteers are supporting individuals, giving them and communities a chance, by sharing Jesus and changing lives. Like thousands of other Street Pastors, our team in Minehead is part of something far bigger than we can imagine, far bigger than our town, community or country.

As we pray and work together, we are following Jesus and impacting peoples lives – and being part of God's vision.

Les Isaac, the founder of Street Pastors, set the tone for the day with his introductory address, urging us to grasp the importance of prayer. He showed how every movement of God through the ages has been soaked in prayer. The aim of the day was that it would be a catalyst to get prayer back in the engine room of power. If we get that right, every thing else will fall into place.

Initially, an in house scheme will launch, whilst we begin the official Ascension Trust process.
