

15 years old

2023 marks fifteen years of Street Pastors serving the people of Newcastle. Current and past Street Pastors enjoyed a service of celebration on 21st September at Newcastle Cathedral. We were joined by several VIPs and heard a message from HRH the Duke of Edinburgh celebrating this achievement (see pictures).

Way back in December 2008, a group of trained volunteers ventured out onto the streets of Newcastle for the first time, not knowing what they would be faced with. Now in 2023, street pastors are very much part of the night-time economy. Street Pastors have made a significant contribution to the safety of the night-time economy. A contribution that Northumbria Police have recognised.

The stats

Since 2008 Street Pastors have

- cared for 5,704 vulnerable people,
- handed out **6,642** pairs of flip flops for foot safety and avoiding hospital,
- given out 12,926 bottles of water for rehydration
- and 6,687 foil blankets for warmth,
- administered First Aid to 671 people,
- binned **45,667** broken bottles and glass.

What we do

We patrol the city centre on Friday and Saturday nights from 10:30 p.m. until 4 a.m. During the patrols, Street Pastors respond to the needs of members of the public. We care for

- those who are incapacitated through alcohol, drugs, or both
- people separated from friends
- those who are sleeping rough, cold, hungry, and thirsty
- those without suitable footwear
- those who need directions to their hotels.

The team carries flip-flops, bottles of water, confectionery, space blankets, and small items of warm clothing. First Aid is administered if needed or advice is given to seek the correct help. e.g., A 'Safe Haven Van' is available on Friday and Saturday evenings, run by Northumbria Police. It offers a warm safe environment to recover in. F.S.N.E. Medical provide a Medical Unit situated next to the Safe Haven.
