We walked up to the new UCLan area and met C who was sitting on the benches there. He has a place to stay be does not like it as he feels unsafe and says its dangerous there. So he spends most of his time outside. We gave him a drink and some chocolate and he told us about how he broke his ankle and that he needs crutches at the moment. He was very grateful to us for taking the time to chat with him and says

Had a chat with a man who witnessed us treating a chap with a face injury. We explained who Street Pastors are and why we do this work. He was interested in the work we do and applauded us for our concern for others. He explained knowing we are on the streets gave him reassurance and less concern for his two young sons when they go out for nights in Preston. Gave him a SP card.

Met young girl at the top of the road to the station taxi rank. Waiting for her parents to pick her up after a visit to Blackpool. Her phone was dead, so we charged it with the booster we had. She was able to contact her parents, who advised they were on the way. We stayed with her to ensure she was safe. Both her parents and her thanked us for the help.

her recovery! They went off to get a taxi

thanking us for our care

Came across E on Fishergate, looked drunk and vulnerable, had become separated from her boyfriend and couldn't remember where she was staying - Premier Inn or Holiday Inn. Established it was Premier Inn and we walked her back to her hotel.

Having worked alongside Preston Street Pastors throughout the last year I have been consistently impressed and inspired by the commitment of the team to support and protect the public of Preston, particularly the most vulnerable.

Paul and his colleagues have been proactive in seeking opportunities to volunteer their time in areas within the City where additional visible guardianship to that provided by statutory services will be most impactive.

The team of Street Pastors continue to positively influence individuals and wider communities and in addition to supporting Preston Police and our partner agencies in keeping people safe.
