

Inheritance Tax

Stirling Street Pastors is a registered charity. This means that a gift in your Will to Stirling Street Pastors is exempt from Inheritance Tax. Your solicitor will be able to advise you further on this. You can see an overview about this tax on the HMRC website <https://gov.uk/inheritance-tax>

Wording for your Will

Here is suggested wording, should you decide to leave a gift in your Will to Stirling Street Pastors:

"I leave to:

Your Will and seeking professional advice

Your Will is a legal document so it is vital to have it drafted or updated by someone who is legally qualified. We advise you to seek the help of a solicitor. They will ensure that your wishes are clearly drafted in accordance with the law. The Law Society of Scotland can help you find a local solicitor. There are a number of free, low-cost or charity schemes available, including the Will Aid initiative which runs each November which means that completing your Will does not need to be an expensive process.

Types of legacy gifts

There are three different types of gift you can make in your Will:

- A gift of a fixed sum of money of your choosing. This type of gift is called a pecuniary legacy. It will decrease in value over your lifetime due to inflation.
- A gift of a specific item, eg land or property or other assets, which is known as a specific legacy.
- A gift of what is left (or part of what is left) after all other bequests and debts have been paid. This is known as a residuary legacy and is not subject to inflation.
