BACK TO NORMAL?

In 2022-23, it seemed that things were back to normal after Covid. We resumed our late night Friday and Saturday patrols and encountered people on the streets who we could help just like we did in 2019-20, pre-pandemic.

But some things had changed.

In 2019-20 we had 30 Street Pastors and now we have 22. That meant that we missed some patrols. We did 75 evening patrols compared to 96 in 2019-20. We are still encouraged by the help we could give on those evenings, 63 vulnerable people were supported, we had 60 important conversations especially about mental health, and 70 people wanted to talk about God. More people are happy to be prayed for too, even if they don't believe. We gave out 101 flip flops, a lot less than usual thanks to fashion changes! We also gave out plenty of water, tea/coffee and lollipops which are always popular. At the end of the night, we made sure many people, who were the worse for wear, got home safely.





A very encouraging change is that we now patrol almost every Friday afternoon on the university campus, 44 patrols last year! We have made many friends there among staff, visitors and students, and been able to comfort several individuals who were suffering from stress and loneliness. It's been great to meet so many people from different nationalities.

THE THREE PILLARS

VOLUNTEERS - It was great to have 4 new recruits join us last year. We also lost 6 who stood down for various reasons. PARTNERSHIPS


Street Pastors come from 16 different churches, a great example of the unity we have in Christ **Why not ask us along for a talk at your church?**

We work together with the Police, CCTV, door stewards and Safebase Scotland. We all use a shared radio network on patrols. We are also supported by Pubwatch and Go Forth Stirling.
