It is very important that people leave respectfully and in good time because complaints from neighbours can affect business licences and these business are very important to our town's economy (as well as being great to go to) so it was good to touch base with BH staff and help out.

Homelessness: We had a web enquiry from a couple who are homeless and Liz sign posted them to the Food Bank and Gill Evans for help. As always, things are not straight froward but we are hoping that SHDC can resolve the situation. SPs also came across a homeless man on shift. He was homeless due to the a personal issues. He is engaging with SHDC to find a home and we hold him very much in our prayers. SPs bought some evening food and breakfast food for him and we believe the situation has now been resolved. Gill Evans, our Rough Sleeper Navigator has been extremely busy but she has also had quite a few successes in seeing people housed.

Kit and Stepping Stones Food Bank have also been a fantastic support to the people mentioned here and all those who find themselves in need.
